Description of the Project/Activity
Name of project, program, activity, event, or initiative.
Stobie Pole Art in Kent Town
Please describe your proposed project, program, activity, event, or initiative.
<p>This is a project implemented by the Kent Town Residents Association (KTRA) for the Kent Town community. It is to be a small pilot project to demonstrate the practical benefit of the proposal.</p> <p>We wish to brighten the suburb, to encourage community pride and add to the increasing number of things to bring people together and to talk about.</p> <p>As Council states in its own documents, streets are particularly important in Kent Town because there is no accessible public green open space or parks within the suburb. Stobie poles are ubiquitous along these streets, are unattractive and in need of focussed decoration and offer a highly visible opportunity to assert the history and optimism of Kent Town residents and businesses through art installations.</p> <p>This is an opportunity to facilitate the growth and vibrancy of community involvement and contribute to the developing sense of community and pride in Kent Town at a time when new growth is happening and expected to increase.</p> <p>This application is for a pilot project to demonstrate the effectiveness of the proposal across the community.</p> <p>Prince Alfred College, Kent Town (PAC) and their staff and students are valuable resources that are being provided freely to this project.</p> <p>The process will be as follows: Overseen by staff and with their considerable experience, skills and knowledge and using PAC resources, students have produced art-work, within teaching time, from which the best will be selected. Staff will digitise the selected art-work which will be transferred to Signlab who will produce art into full digital laminate sheets affixed to PVC panels that comply with SA Power Networks guidelines. Members of the Kent Town Residents Association will then glue the panels to stobie poles which have been approved by SA Power Networks.</p>

This will be a highly participative project managed and implemented by KTRA and with the involvement of Kent Town residents, and assisted by students and staff of Prince Alfred College and with valuable in-kind resources.

The **Kent Town Residents Association** (ktra.net) is a non-partisan, membership-based organisation that represents and acts on behalf of Kent Town residents, to maintain and improve the living conditions, community wellbeing and amenity of the place.

Prince Alfred College is an iconic and historic College within South Australia and an important member of the Kent Town community.

SA Power Networks manages the Stobie poles across SA and has approved the use of identified poles in Kent Town.

Objective 3. An engaged and participating community.

The *CityPlan 2030* performance indicators here address opportunities for community engagement.

This is a very participative, whole-of-community public art project, developed by the KTRA and will involve students and staff of PAC and residents and businesses across Kent Town and Kaurna Nation representatives. The art on Stobie poles will be highly visible and will welcome visitors through this 'Gateway to the East' and be a visual representation of an engaged and participating community. Input will be sought from residents, businesses and institutions about ideas for art works, and participation in painting them, and about which panels will be placed and where.

This project is directed at residents and businesses in Capper St, the Parade West, Dequetteville Tce and Flinders St. There are 32 poles that have been approved in these streets.

These streets are among those addressed in the Greening of Kent Town project in which the NPSP Council and KTRA participated and the Greening Grassroots Grant which KTRA secured. These areas will be further enhanced by stobie pole art.

The images within this project will reflect the Kent Town built history and through their placement and visual stories will reinforce the importance of its protection.

How will your project or activity benefit and involve the City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters Community and enhance community well-being?

This public art project is a highly visual indicator of the values and history of the community and will contribute to the pride and sense of community of its residents and businesses.
Kent Town is a growing community of residents and businesses and a suburb through which many commuters pass. The project will inform about the importance and contribution of Kent Town to the wider City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters.
The project will complement other initiatives facilitated by the KTRA with the aim to make Kent Town a more liveable community.

Will your activity enable members of the local community to increase their skills, knowledge and understanding and encourage meaningful participation and involvement in community life?

This is a highly participative project. The KTRA has 70 active members who regularly contribute to community activities. The PAC community on an average day hosts about 1250 students and staff as well as a Boarding College of some 100 residents. The PAC leadership wishes to involve its staff and students in Kent Town community activities as an ongoing aspect of its curriculum.

An important way to encourage and facilitate community engagement is to enable projects such as this, which, on a street-by-street method, offers opportunities for residents to participate and meet and exchange views. This principle underlies the other current KTRA activities such as the Community Garden, the Tree Mapping project, the Grenfell St community verge enhancement project, the Neighbour Day celebration, and the participation by residents in the development of the very important *A Liveable Kent Town: Our Plan*.

What are the anticipated outcomes of the project/activity? (I.e. what do you want to achieve?).

The outputs will be 32 public art panels highly visible and installed on Stobie poles across Kent Town to demonstrate the viability and effectiveness of the activity. The panels are expected to be in situ for two years periods, or longer depending on need to change art images around.

The outcomes will be an enhanced understanding of, and sense of place of Kent Town; a sense of vibrancy and pride that complements the other developments across the suburb; a more integrated community with institutions, residents and businesses recognising their shared interests and willing to cooperate about further improvements to the liveability of Kent Town.

How will you know if your project, program, activity, event, or initiative has been successful? How will you know if you have achieved your intended outcomes?

The completion of the installation of the panels is a visible indicator.

The extent and nature of the participation in this and growing participation in other community activities in Kent Town.

Feedback will be sought across all aspects of the community about the project's process and outcomes to demonstrate the value of extending the project more widely across the suburb.
